The forum and voice for carers and people who use mental health, learning disability, older people, and drug and alcohol services in Surrey and North East Hampshire, provided by Surrey & Borders Partnership NHS Foundation Trust. Public meetings where NHS Managers learn from people who have experienced these services, what works well and what could be improved. FoCUS members are carers and people who use services, or have used services in the last five years.

Please ask for help if you need it during these challenging times

The Trust and other local organisations are continuing to offer support including:

- **The Mental Health Crisis Helpline 0800 915 4644 is open 24 hours a day, 365 days a year** for mental health advice and support. People with speech or hearing difficulties can access the service through SMS text 07717 989024. For text support for people with hearing impairments, dial 18001 0800 915 4644 from your text phone or smartphone app. More information at www.relayuk.bt.com
- **The five Safe Havens across Surrey and North East Hampshire are now offering people experiencing a mental health crisis and carers an out of hours virtual service.** This means that people can receive expert guidance and support from mental health nurses and trained mental health practitioners at the Safe Havens without leaving home. The virtual Safe Havens are open from 6-11pm, seven days a week – the same hours as the Safe Haven sites in Epsom, Guildford, Redhill, Woking and Aldershot. **Links to the virtual safe haven are on the Trusts website <https://www.sabp.nhs.uk/our-services/mental-health/safe-havens>**
- **Surrey County Council has set up a Community Helpline number 0300 200 1008** (SMS: 0786 0053 465 for Deaf and hearing impaired residents only). The helpline is to help direct residents who need support, such as picking up shopping, prescription collections or having someone who can be a telephone friend. **The Hampshire Coronavirus Support and Helpline can be contacted on 0333 370 4000.**
- To reduce isolation and loneliness **Surrey Coalition of Disabled People offers social activities every week day** which can be joined virtually or by calling a freephone number. For more information please contact Jane Ahmed or the Surrey Coalition's details below.
